February 5, 2025 – Undergraduate Council Meeting

New business:

1. Program Proposals:
 - a. Computational Linguistics Certificate
- The Dietrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed the proposal from the Linguistics Department to offer a Computational Linguistics Certificate with two separate tracks.
 - i. The Linguistics Track (CompLing-LING track)
 1. The Linguistics track is intended for Linguistics and language major and minors in the Dietrich school to gain proficiency in computational

methods and data skills for linguistic problem solving.

2. The requirements, as proposed, include 17 or 18 credits (in addition to the 27 credits for prerequisites shared by both tracks) of Linguistic and Computer Science coursework following the following format:

- a. LING 1330, CS 1684 (or CS 590), LING 1810 (or LING 1269), LING 1340, 1 elective and a capstone (2 or 3 credits)

- ii. The Computer Science Track (CompLing-CS track)

1. The Computer Science track is designed for Computer Science and other majors in the School of Computing and Information to gain technical proficiency in natural language engineering.

2. The requirements, as proposed, include 18 credits (in addition to the 27 credits for prerequisites shared by both tracks) of Linguistic and Computer Science coursework following the following format:

- a. LING 1130, CS 1684, CS 1671, CS 1571 (or CS 1675), 1 elective and a capstone)

- iii. The proposal was moved, seconded, and passed.

- iv. Computational Linguistics Certificate approved.

- v. NOTE: The Linguistics Department will work with Assistant Dean Andrew Lotz to secure letters of support from the

Computer Science Department and/or School-level support from the Associate Dean and/or Dean of the School of Computing and Information (SCI) since the certificate draws significantly from coursework offered via SCI.

New business:

MPCOMM/English/Communications/Media Design Certificate Continued Discussion to potentially establish online versions of existing DSAS majors targeted toward CGS students.

- a. Boryana Dobрева presented the results of the Media and Professional Communications (MPCOMM) student focus group which discussed student background and motivation to pursue this major, as well as program experience and satisfaction. Students were excited by the diverse coursework, flexibility and practical skills gained in this program, and expressed overall satisfaction with the program. They also discussed challenges and areas for improvement,

noting the difficulty in finding available courses, balancing scheduling conflicts of required classes with internships and preference of asynchronous, hybrid, and in-person classes over Zoom classes.

- b. Andrew presented a visual mapping of the draft proposals for online Public and Professional Writing (PPW) major and Strategic Communication for Media Professionals (SCMP) major to show where these proposals overlap, and where there are gaps in what was covered by the MPCOMM major.

- c. Andrew then presented the beginning draft outline of a Media Design Certificate that might serve as a useful supplement to the online PPW and SCMP, and still offer a fully online certificate for students to gain practical skills in Media Design. This proposal is a work in progress as Andrew Lotz and Adriana Helbig meet with the Studio Arts and Film Studies departments.

2. CGS Teaching Awards Update a. The deadline to nominate has been extended to February 7th.

3. CGS Student Government Updates
 - a. Student council is starting their election and hiring process. Work continues for the CGS student government display on the digital wall in Hillman Library this summer. Student Government is also working on contacting CGS alumni

for their spring event and would like to participate in the SGB student government's major/minor fair.

Dietrich School Graduate Council Report

February 3, 2025, Meeting

1. Associate Dean's Updates
Associate Dean Woon provided several updates, including the progress of the Summer Writing Scholars program at PLE. Center for Mentoring is advancing the Foundations of Graduate Mentoring curriculum, expecting an asynchronous module ready for a DGS pilot at month's end. Federal funding remains uncertain, with the university actively monitoring the situation alongside government relations and legal offices. International students who have questions should seek assistance from specialists in OIS. Additionally, the Race & Latinx Research Slam on January 30, 2025, brought together faculty, students, and former KLI/HMB participants, fostering valuable interdisciplinary connections.

2. Assistant Dean's Updates

Assistant Dean Coutanche advised that the fellowship selections are currently in progress, with orientation meetings completed and selection meetings beginning soon. He has also sent questions to Directors of Graduate Studies regarding thesis and oral defense challenges and is finalizing a memo on annual committee meetings and the roles and responsibilities of the DGS.

3. Award for Excellence in Graduate Mentoring
Council discussed whether the award should be limited to faculty with primary appointments in the Dietrich School. Council favored a more inclusive approach to allow those with secondary appointments who mentor DSAS graduate students to be eligible.
4. Academic Integrity Subcommittee
The Academic Integrity Code (AIC) Subcommittee presented a progress report developing guidance regarding graduate-related concerns not adequately covered by the existing AIC.
5. Assessment Reporting Pilot AY22-AY25
Associate Dean Woon noted that we are approaching the end of the three-year pilot period and may discuss the Assessment reporting at the next meeting. The process has yielded positive changes, with potential to further enhance student involvement
