New business:

- 1. Program Proposal:

- A. Geology BS Modification- The Dietrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Geology and Environmental Science department to modify the Geology BS.
- i. The modifications, as proposed, include the following:
 1. requiring students to take one semester each of Calculus, Physics and Chemistry in addition to a broader choice of three classes that include BIOSC 0835, BIOSC 0151 and BIOSC 0157, BIOSC 0160, STAT 1221
 2. The department is also swapping in GEOL 0802 to replace GEOL 0860
 - ii. These changes will reduce the credit requirement from 28 to 24.
 - iii. The proposal was moved, seconded and approved.
 - iv. **Geology BS Modification Approved**
- B. Chemical Biology BS (New)- The Dietrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Chemistry department to create a new 61 credit Chemical Biology, BS.
- i. The program, as proposed, includes the following:
 1. 20 credits in Physics, Math and Biology
 2. 19 credits in Chemistry
 3. 19 Credits in Chemical Biology
 4. 3 credits in a science elective
 - ii. The proposal was moved, seconded and approved.
 - iii. **Chemical Biology BS Approved**
- C. Italian Major BA, Modification- The Deitrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Department of French and Italian to modify the Italian Major BA.
- i. The modifications, as proposed, include the following:
 1. Reducing the four credit language courses (now numbered ITAL 0010, ITAL 0020, ITAL 0030, ITAL 0040) to three credits per course
 2. Re-numbering the elementary and intermediate level courses to reduce student confusion
 3. Adding ITAL 0414 as an intermediate option
 4. Counting ITAL 0010 towards the major
 - ii. These changes will reduce the number of required credits from 36 to 33.
 - iii. The proposal was moved, seconded, and passed.
 - iv. **Italian Major BA Modification Approved**
- D. Italian Studies BA, Modification- - The Deitrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Department of French and Italian to modify the Italian Studies BA.
- i. The modifications, as proposed, include the following:
 1. Reducing the four credit language courses (now numbered ITAL 0010, ITAL 0020, ITAL 0030, ITAL 0040) to three credits per course
 2. Re-numbering the elementary and intermediate level courses to reduce student confusion
 3. Adding ITAL 0414 as an intermediate option
 4. Counting ITAL 0010 towards the major

5. Removing ITAL 0091 from the core requirements
 6. Removing the capstone course option.
 - ii. These changes will reduce the number of required credits from 36 to 33.
 - iii. The proposal was moved, seconded, and passed.
 - iv. **Italian Studies BA Modification Approved**
- E. Eastern European and Slavic Studies BA, New- The Deitrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures to create a new 33 credit Eastern European and Slavic Studies, BA.
- i. The program, as proposed, includes the following:
 1. Students will complete six semesters (or equivalent summer study) in one language, such as BCMS, Polish, Russian, Slovak and Ukrainian
 2. Two core courses (SLAV 0500 and a choice of SLAV 0850, SLAV 1850, SLOVAK 0890 or RUSS 0860)
 3. Fifteen elective credits (at least two of which must be offered by the Slavic department, and one must be a writing-intensive course)
 - a. Students will have the option to substitute up to two of the electives by continuing their primary language to the fourth year or higher, or developing a proficiency (either beginning, middle or advanced level) in a Slavic or Eastern European language from one of the following:
 - i. A Slavic or Eastern European language from the core offerings or
 - ii. An additional language at Pitt (sch as Modern Greek, Hungarian or Turkish) or
 - iii. Other languages taken outside of Pitt (such as Bulgarian, Czech, Estonian, Latvian or Lithuanian)
 - ii. The proposal was moved, seconded, and passed.
 - iii. **Eastern European and Slavic Studies BA Approved**
- F. Journalism Track in Writing Major Termination- The Deitrich School Undergraduate Council reviewed a proposal from the Department of English to terminate the Journalism track in the Writing Major BA, which has now been replaced by the recently approved Journalism Certificate.

New Business:

- 1) Program Proposals:
- a) CGS Health Professionals Post-Baccalaureate Certificate (Andrew Lotz) Presenter Andrew Lotz presented the proposal to create a new certificate which prepares students with completed bachelor's degrees for the next steps in pursuing a career in a wide variety of health professions. This certificate will

provide a rigorous credential that demonstrates readiness to enter a graduate educational program such as medical school, dental school, physician's assistant program, veterinary science, or public health.

- i) Council reviewed the proposal to offer the Health Professionals Post-Baccalaureate Certificate, which is an 18-credit post-baccalaureate certificate to be housed in the College of General Studies.

- ii) The requirements as proposed include completion of 18 credits following the following format:
 - (1) 6 courses from a provided list of advanced natural science courses from the Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Neuroscience and Statistics Departments.

- (i) Students must maintain a grade of B+ or better in every course counted towards the certificate and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.5 for all courses used for the certificate.

- (ii) Students may be required to complete pre-requisite courses prior to enrolling in the courses on the list.

- iii) The proposal was moved, seconded and approved by the College of General Studies Council.

Health Professions Post-Baccalaureate Certificate Approved

- b) Media and Professional Communications, BA Retirement (Klaus Libertus)
 - i) Klaus presented the proposal to retire the MPCOMM program, which has now been replaced by three

recently approved programs (namely, the Social Media and Digital Creation Certificate, Online Public and Professional Writing, and Strategic Communication for Media Professionals major).

- ii) The proposal was moved, seconded and approved by the College of General Studies Council
Media and Professional Communications, BA Retirement Approved

- 2) CGS Spring 2026 Enrollment Numbers (Boryana Dobрева)

Boryana highlighted the upward CGS enrollment trends over the last five years, noting that CGS enrollment has surpassed the 2024 and 2025 numbers. She also discussed the growth of program degrees and certificates within CGS, highlighting the popularity of the 14 current CGS certificates. Finally, she shared the data on the reciprocal relationship between CGS and other Pitt schools as CGS courses (mainly those taken online) are taken by students in 14 different Pitt schools and campuses, and CGS students conversely take courses across Pitt in various schools, programs and campuses.

- 3) CGS Faculty Updates (Klaus Libertus)
 Klaus presented updates from last month's CGS faculty meeting where they discussed faculty workload, Chat GPT Zero and AI policies, as well as the policy regarding students enrolling in classes that are full. Klaus noted that many departments have not yet considered CGS service within their department workloads and requested clarification on the student enrollment policy for full classes. Adriana confirmed that students cannot be enrolled into full classes. CGS will continue to facilitate

broader conversations on AI in the classroom.

- 4) Student Government Updates (Matt Tang)
 Matt highlighted several spring events held by CGS student government including an opportunity for public service students to interact and engage with Pitt's Public Service Director, off campus fun events like candle making, on campus meet and greets in the Carlson event center to build community, and a Narcan tabling event created by a CGS ambassador. Matt also encouraged the Council to spread the word of the upcoming CGS alumni networking event and shared the results of the CGS student government election.
